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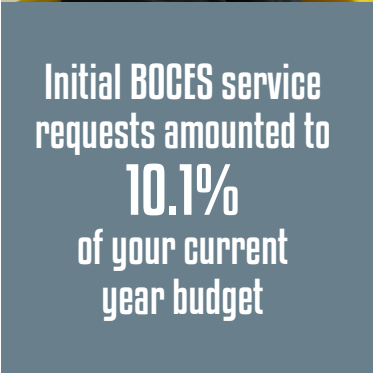

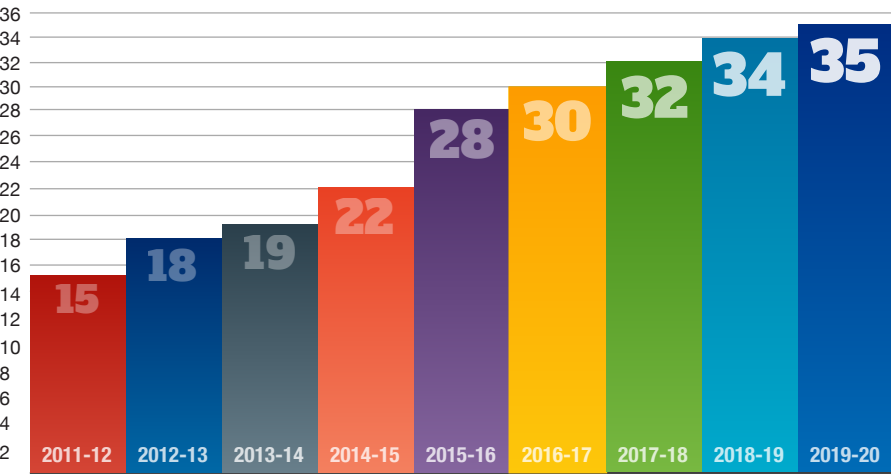
Career & Technical Education

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

OCM BOCES & North Syracuse = Student Success



Over the past two years, North Syracuse junior Justin Sims has flourished in the STARS Innovative Education program at OCM BOCES.

“Justin has become a leader at STARS,” said his principal, Emily Behan. “He instills a sense of community among his peers and holds everyone to a high standard. He is truly a positive role model for the entire community.”

Justin attributes his success at STARS to the smaller high school setting and individualized attention. He has also developed strong relationships with the STARS staff — his favorite aspect of the program — and many of his classmates.

“Since coming to BOCES, I have become more independent and much more motivated,” he said. “I feel like I am meant to be here as a part of the school community.”

Justin has taken a noticeable leadership role with the school’s Friends of Rachel (FOR) Club, a program that seeks to instill a culture of kindness and compassion in the school. Justin has also become involved in peer mediation and restoration.

“He consistently makes positive contributions to our community through his interactions with everyone he encounters,” said Wendy Lloyd, a social worker.

Overall, he has developed a sense of confidence that helps him persevere, overcome adversity, and participate successfully with many different teams, including the North Syracuse football team and boxing groups, staff members said.

“Over the past two years, we have seen Justin evolve as a student and as a young man,” said his teaching assistant, Jennie Robb. “He perseveres when things are tough, and, even when challenged, gives it his all.”

Did You Know?

Teachers in the North Syracuse Central School District elementary schools invited science center coaches into their classrooms to help plan and teach lessons from the Smithsonian science curriculum. This work helped to improve the comfort level of elementary science teachers so that students will get the benefit of all of the curricular resources that the Smithsonian program provides.
