New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

For West Genesee junior Anna lauco, the hands-on experience of working with patients in the OCM BOCES Health Occupations program has been eye-opening. "I like that I've been able to work with actual people," Anna said. "Patients often tell us how much it means to them that we come to visit, and I've seen firsthand how it helps them and makes them happy."

Anna grew up hearing stories about patients from her grandmother, an emergency room nurse. Hearing these stories sparked her interest in helping people in the same way.

By the time she graduates, Anna will have gained over 100 hours of hands-on training in the Health Occupations program. This training will allow her to become familiar with medical terminology, basic

nursing, long-term care, ethical practices, and more. Knowing that she has the potential to graduate from high school with her New York State Certified Nursing Assistant license has also motivated Anna to work harder and focus more on her studies at both OCM BOCES and West Genesee. Her instructor, Meridith Kindred, has noticed Anna's dedication to the program.

"Anna is an eager learner," Kindred said. "This works well in the class and with her patients. She is also an excellent role model for her peers, as she is a true team player and always has a positive attitude. This attitude has helped her relationships with the patients she interacts with as well. She knows that being there for them makes a difference."

After high school, Anna plans to go to school to become a registered nurse. Since she has enjoyed the hands-on learning experience with OCM BOCES, she hopes to attend St. Joseph's College of Nursing to continue this hands-on approach. After graduation, she hopes to work in a hospital emergency room.

"I've learned so much that I know I will use in the future," Anna said. "I feel prepared for this career path, thanks to OCM BOCES."

Did You Know?

Educators in West Genesee have begun to dive deep into secondary science standards and curriculum. Teachers and administrators across the district have begun to explore curriculum at both the middle school and high school levels.
