Career & Technical Education

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

For Baldwinsville junior Jacob Herrington, working on heavy-diesel equipment at Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse offers an ideal opportunity to prepare for a career in the field. The half-day OCM BOCES Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology program complements what he loves to do in his spare time — build model vehicles — and supports his long-term goal of becoming a heavy-diesel technician for the military.

His teacher, Bryan Wilson, said Jacob has excelled in all areas of the class.

“This program incorporates his interests and hobbies into one, so he gets to do what he loves,” Wilson said.

Jacob is in his first year of the two-year program, which offers an on-site classroom at Tracey Road Equipment and a spacious, dedicated garage for students to do hands-on work with heavy-diesel equipment, including several engines and a semi-tractor. It also offers opportunities for students to work side-by-side with Tracey Road professionals in other parts of the site.

OCM BOCES partnered with Tracey Road Equipment to create the embedded program with the goal of offering a unique, hands-on opportunity for students to prepare for a career and a pipeline of potential employees for Tracey Road and other businesses.

Jacob loves his time in the program, especially working with professional technicians and getting to do the hands-on work he loves. He also performs well in the classroom, completing all his work “on time and with a lot of pride,” Wilson said.

Looking ahead, Jacob hopes to begin his career in the military by signing up for the National Guard. In the meantime, he is soaking up all the knowledge and experience he can at OCM BOCES.

“Jacob is so involved with the schoolwork and with the hands-on work that he has really taken to the trade,” Wilson said. “He is trying to learn as much as he can.”

Did You Know?

During the summer of 2022, implementation teams from all eight of Baldwinsville’s schools attended a turnkey Restorative Practices training led by OCM BOCES Instructional Support Services staff. The implementation teams were then able to provide initial training to building staff at the start of the school year as they seek to utilize Restorative Practices district-wide. Implementation teams will continue to receive more training and support as they progress throughout the year.
