

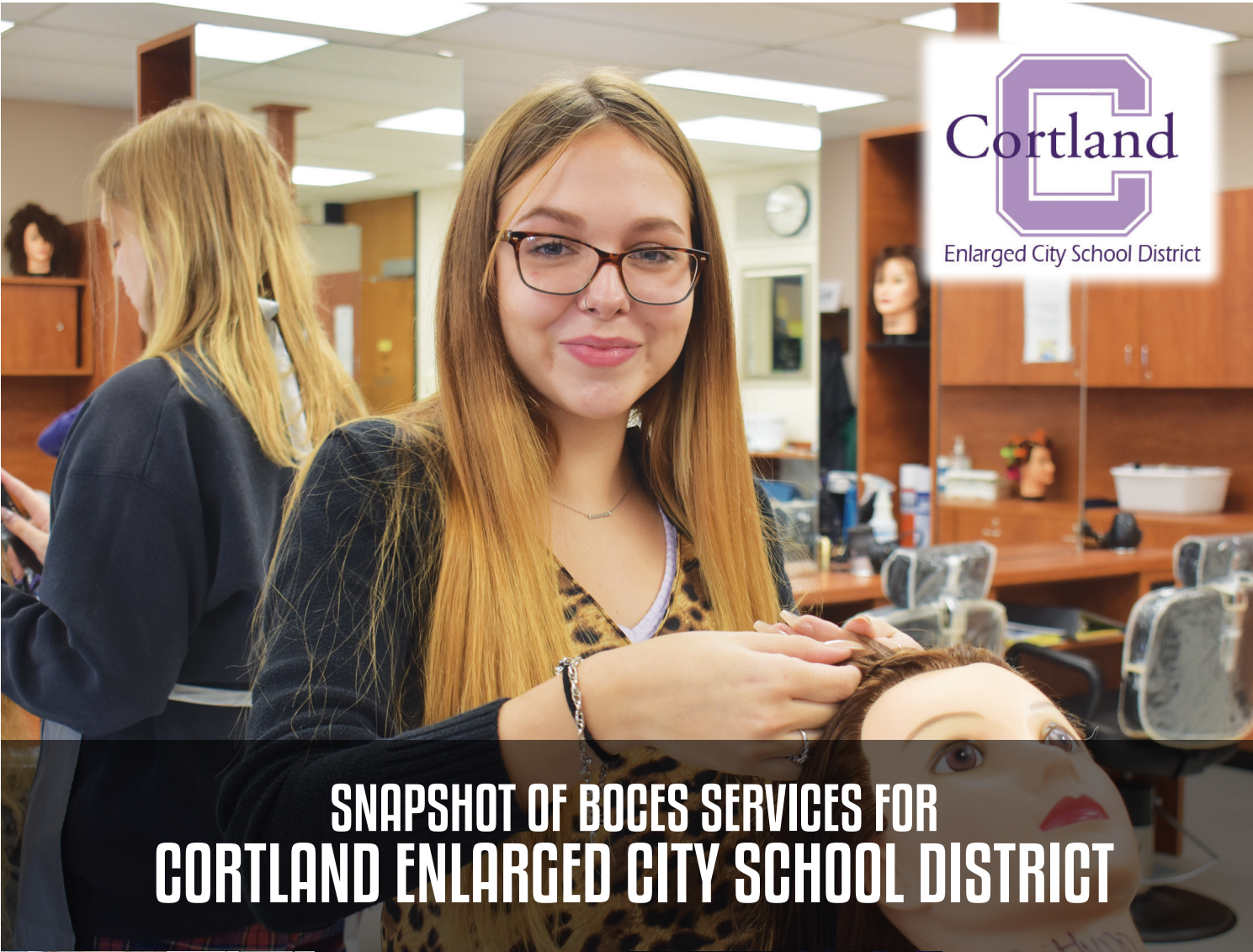

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Cortland students Patrick Busutti, Adam Carstens, Jacob Couture, Queen Nefertiti Faircloth, Hannah Guernsey, Sydney Henry, David Januszka, Rylee King, George Lynch, Emily L. When Kaitlyn Egolf moved from Pulaski to Cortland three years ago, this quiet, introverted ninth-grader wanted to find a small high school setting to help ease the transition.

“My mom and I searched for educational opportunities and found Seven Valleys New Tech Academy,” said Kaitlyn, who is now a senior. “After a day of shadowing, I knew this school would fit my style of learning. I came in as a more reserved student, and, over the years, I’ve become much more confident as a student and as a person.”

Kaitlyn is still soft-spoken, but she is thriving academically and socially at Seven Valleys. As a junior, she was inducted into the National Honor Society because of her high academic standing. She continues to participate in service projects for NHS and as part of the Friends of Rachel (FOR) Club, a student organization committed to nurturing a culture of kindness and compassion in school. Kaitlyn recently facilitated an activity that focused on gratitude for the school’s Thanksgiving celebration. The school’s social worker, Elizabeth Henrichs, was impressed.

“This was a big leap for Kaitlyn because of her quiet disposition, but she was able to lead her peers through a gratitude circle, the creation of a thankfulness wreath, and a writing activity that had each student write about who they were thankful for within the school community and why,” Henrichs said.

Academically, Kaitlyn enjoys all of her classes but has taken a keen interest in chemistry and biology, which suits her lifelong passion for animals. Her science facilitator, Jake Melnyk, said Kaitlyn stands out as a classroom leader.

“Kaitlyn shares unique insights and wisdom with her project teams and is an avid collaborator and motivator,” he said. “She inspires those around her while pursuing her own interests in research.”

Looking ahead, Kaitlyn hopes to study zoology in college, with the ultimate goal of working in a zoo. “My favorite thing is the community here,” Kaitlyn said of Seven Valleys. “Since it’s a smaller school, you can build closer relationships with students and teachers. This school is also very hands-on, so I feel more prepared for college.”
