
# **Career & Technical Education**

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including DeRuyter students Nicholas Husner, and Breanna Shelby.

Based at Homer Central High School, STAR stands for "Skills Toward Adult Responsibility." For Ethan, the program offers individualized instruction, an emphasis on living skills, and a small,

structured environment that supports his success.

"Our program is structured to have consistency and routine, which Ethan thrives in," said his teacher, Rebekah Stull. "The smaller class sizes allow him to have more one-to-one interactions with staff, and having the same group of students in his cohort allows him to be more confident socially."

Four years ago, when Ethan first entered the STAR program, he did not enjoy coming to school.

"Now he comes to school with a positive attitude, ready to be successful," Stull said.

Ethan's favorite subject at BOCES is art, which fuels his creative spirit. He recently took pride in his drawing of a four-wheeler, improving the art with each new effort.

Stull said Ethan is a pleasure to have in class. Others described him as a "leader in the classroom" with a real "zest for life."

"Ethan has taken advantage of the opportunities in the STAR program and will be successful in the future," Stull said.

# Did You Know?

DeRuyter continues to support the efforts of the Fine Arts Leadership Network at OCM BOCES. Dr. David M. Brown, Superintendent of Schools, has been a thought partner for the facilitators of the group. He has spoken at multiple meetings about the Individual Arts Assessment Pathway (IAAP) and the journey DeRuyter took as a potential pilot district. Dr. Brown also helped facilitate the visioning meeting and helped to identify partners in advocacy efforts.
