
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Fabius-Pompey students Jayden Evans, Kaitlynn Golden, Jonathan Litz, Jesse Pilcher, Jamie Ratliff, and Matthew Sheffield.

OCM BOCES & Fabius-Pompey = Student Success



Eliza Taubman has been active in the OCM BOCES Early Childhood Education program embedded in CAPCO — the Cortland County Community Action Program — for just a few months. Still, the once-quiet junior has quickly opened up and is now "shining in the classroom," her teacher said. She is making connections with her classmates from other districts and impressing the CAPCO Head Start staff with her kindness, positive attitude, and willingness to take initiative.

"She is very personable and passionate about her experience here," said Heather Tuttle, her OCM BOCES teacher. "Her hard work and dedication is evident every day. She has been a wonderful asset to our program."

This year, Eliza has been able to work in the preschool classrooms at CAPCO Headstart, which means she and her classmates can apply the theory and knowledge they learn inside their Early Childhood Education classroom, which is housed in the same building. Tuttle said one of Eliza's exceptional projects this year was the creation of an "interactive file folder game" to help children learn about shapes and colors. Teachers in the preschool classrooms have kept the games for children to use.

For Eliza, the Early Childhood Education program fits well with her goal of going to college after high school to become a teacher. In fact, Eliza will have the opportunity to earn up to nine college credits through Tompkins Cortland Community College during the two-year program.

"BOCES has helped me see how much more there is to teaching," Eliza said. "I have learned so much that I never would have learned if I had not taken this class. I love going into the classrooms to work with the children and the teachers. It's not something everyone is able to do."

Tuttle said everything Eliza is learning in the Early Childhood Education program "is critical to working with young children." But it helps that Eliza is "a natural," she added.

The preschool staff says Eliza "really shines in the classroom. She engages with the children in positive ways and knows how to connect and interact with them on all levels. She is a pleasure to have in the classroom, and the children look forward to her arrival every week."
