
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.



Matt Kneer knew OCM BOCES was going to be a good fit because he loves doing hands-on work and learns better when he is active and on his feet. What he didn't expect was becoming a leader and role model in the two-year Automotive Collision Technology program at the OCM BOCES Thompson Road Campus. Matt, now a senior, regularly takes the lead on classroom projects.

"When Matt first entered the collision class, he was quiet and reserved," said his teacher, Matthew McGivney. "As time went on and he felt more comfortable, he began to slowly open up and become a leader within his peer group. For example, he participates in class discussions and takes the lead in completing the hands-on portion of the program. He is also very conscientious about doing his best work."

Matt said he enjoys the class because he feels like it is directly preparing him for his future. Students in the program learn the fundamentals of vehicle refinishing, metal work, body and frame alignment, painting and finishing, welding, plastics repair, body repair and replacement, cost estimation and customer service skills. They also participate in an internship and have the opportunity to earn a Career and Technical Endorsement on their high school diploma if they can pass an industry-standard assessment.

One of Matt's career goals is to work in the automotive collision field and eventually own his own business. McGivney thinks Matt will do well in any of his ventures because he is committed to doing well, has excellent attendance, and "always persists until he understands new things."

Matt, for example, took the lead in restoring a 1977 boat as part of a class project. When it was done, the quality of the final product was "the talk of the shop," McGivney said.

"Matt was very proud of this accomplishment," McGivney said. "He knows that achieving anything worthwhile takes time and consistent effort."
