
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by District Administration magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

Number of classrooms in school district buildings that host BOCES Special Education Programs



For Homer senior Nathan McMullin, working on heavy-diesel equipment at All County Collision & Repair has given him a solid foundation for a career in the field.

That, he said, was exactly what he was hoping for.

"This will really enhance my skills," he said. "I like that the engines are more intricate and require more detail."

Nathan is in his second year of the two-year program, called Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations and Diesel Technology. It combines classroom instruction at Homer Central High School with a work-based learning environment inside the shop. Students perform hands-on work with heavy-diesel equipment, including engines and a semi-tractor. They also work side-by-side with

experienced technicians.

OCM BOCES partnered with All County Collision & Repair in 2021 to support students who are interested in the field and also help the company create a pipeline of employees in the heavy-diesel industry. Nathan wants to take full advantage of that opportunity by honing his technican skills during high school and college, then looking for a full-time job.

Nathan's dedication to auto mechanics and diesel technology — something he also likes to work on in his free time — has caught the eye of the company's owner, Ken Morey, who described him as "attentive and knowledgeable of his skills."

His teacher, Brian Holl, agrees.

"Nate already had a great base of understanding when he entered this program," Holl said. "But with the class and the handson learning in the shop, his knowledge has greatly improved, and he has excelled."
