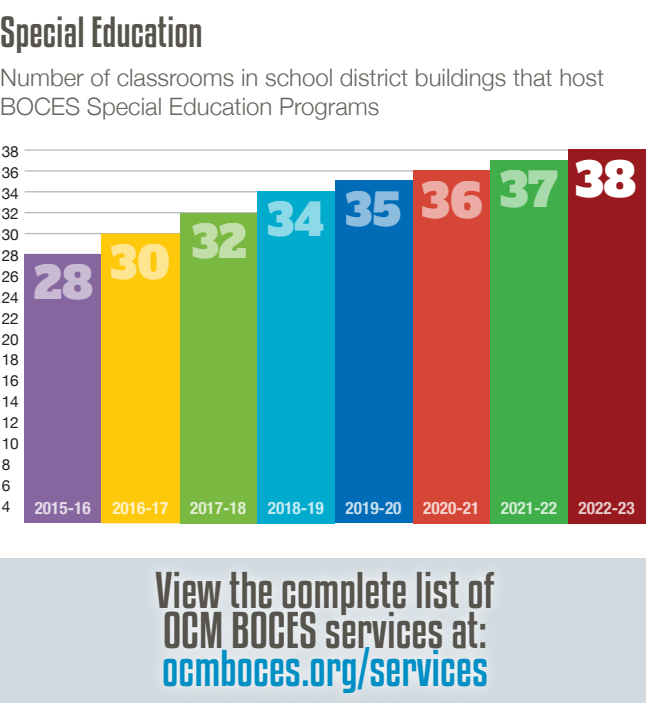

Career & Technical Education

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.


In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Jamesville-DeWitt students Henry Buff, Joshua Chen, Paul Conley, Andrew Flint, Carson Horn, Anthony Klish, Joshua Melick, Alice O’Connor, and Alexandria Sugar.

OCM BOCES & Jamesville-DeWitt = Student Success



James Pauls was smiling non-stop during a recent lesson about the five senses in the OCM BOCES SKATE program at Jamesville Elementary School. This 4-year-old kindergartener from Jamesville-DeWitt loved exploring different materials and textures using his sense of touch.

His teacher, Corrine Campbell, said James had a wonderful time with this particular lesson, but the joy on his face was no exception: James smiles every day — “with every success and challenge,” she said — and loves being with his teachers and classmates.

“James is smart, funny, playful and a pleasure to have in our classroom,” Campbell said. “His smile lights up the room.”

James, who has autism, is new to the OCM BOCES SKATE program, which stands for Scaffolding Kids’ Abilities Through Education. The program offers an individualized curriculum for students with autism and a clearly organized, structured routine to support life skills, socialization, and peer interactions. The program has already benefitted James because of the visual and video supports he receives to help him navigate through his day. In addition, having the SKATE classroom at Jamesville Elementary School allows James to learn and grow with his general-education peers.

Campbell said James has been making steady progress since the start of the new school year. His favorite activity is physical therapy — especially a ball pit — and he loves stacking objects and interacting with toys that teach cause and effect.

His speech pathologist, Maureen Vredenburgh, said James is a wonderful student and a positive influence in the class.

“He has an infectious personality that we look forward to every day,” she said. “He’s eager to learn and loves having fun with his teachers.”

Did You Know?

Jamesville-Dewitt has two students attending the OCM BOCES Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) during the 2022-2023 school year. The VLA is broken up into grades K-5 for elementary, 7-8 for middle school, and 9-12 for high school. Teachers deliver “live” instruction via Google Meet throughout a traditional bell-scheduled day for students who cannot attend school in person. Teachers engage students in the curriculum by utilizing technology, delivering interactive lessons, and using breakout rooms for group work. Students have the option to participate in activities such as Student Council, a virtual talent show, a digital yearbook club, and much more. Last year, six students from Jamesville-DeWitt attended the VLA.
