
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including McGraw students Quintin Burdick, Autumn Casterline, Jennifer Curtis, Dylan Ignatowski, Marta Kostiuk, Shauntell Nichols, Cameron Nitti, Kaden Randall, Jason Rude, Liberty Sutton, and Collin Thompson.

Daltyn Busby had never done welding before signing up for the OCM BOCES Welding Technology class for his junior year. Now he loves it, and he wants to make it a career.

"My goals after high school are to continue welding, maybe start my own business, and weld until I can't weld anymore," said Daltyn, who is now a senior.

His teacher, Kevin Auyer, said Daltyn is a tremendously hard worker.

"He has put in countless hours on task in his welding booth to hone his skills," Auver said. "His efforts have been rewarded with increased success on all his weld tests."

In one notable project, Daltyn and his classmates used their math and welding skills to design and build a structure that would hold four liters of water. Daltyn's finished structure held the precise amount, matched a blueprint perfectly, and did not leak. Another welding test — the industry-standard "3G bend test" — resulted in a top-notch performance for Daltyn.

Outside of welding, Daltyn is known for being an exceptionally warm, caring person and a positive influence at the OCM BOCES Cortlandville Campus. During one class, Daltyn asked Auyer if he could speak to him in the hallway, then asked quietly if he could bring in a pair of shoes for a student who needed them. "He said he had an extra pair," Auyer said.

"It's amazing how much Daltyn has grown both as a student and as a person during his time here," Auyer said.

Daltyn is grateful for the opportunities he has had at OCM BOCES and appreciative of his instructors, including Auyer, Hannah Hones and Eliza Vitale. He describes the hands-on, focused work of welding as a "stress reliever" and a nice break from having to learn at a desk.

"BOCES has really helped me connect with school," he said.
