

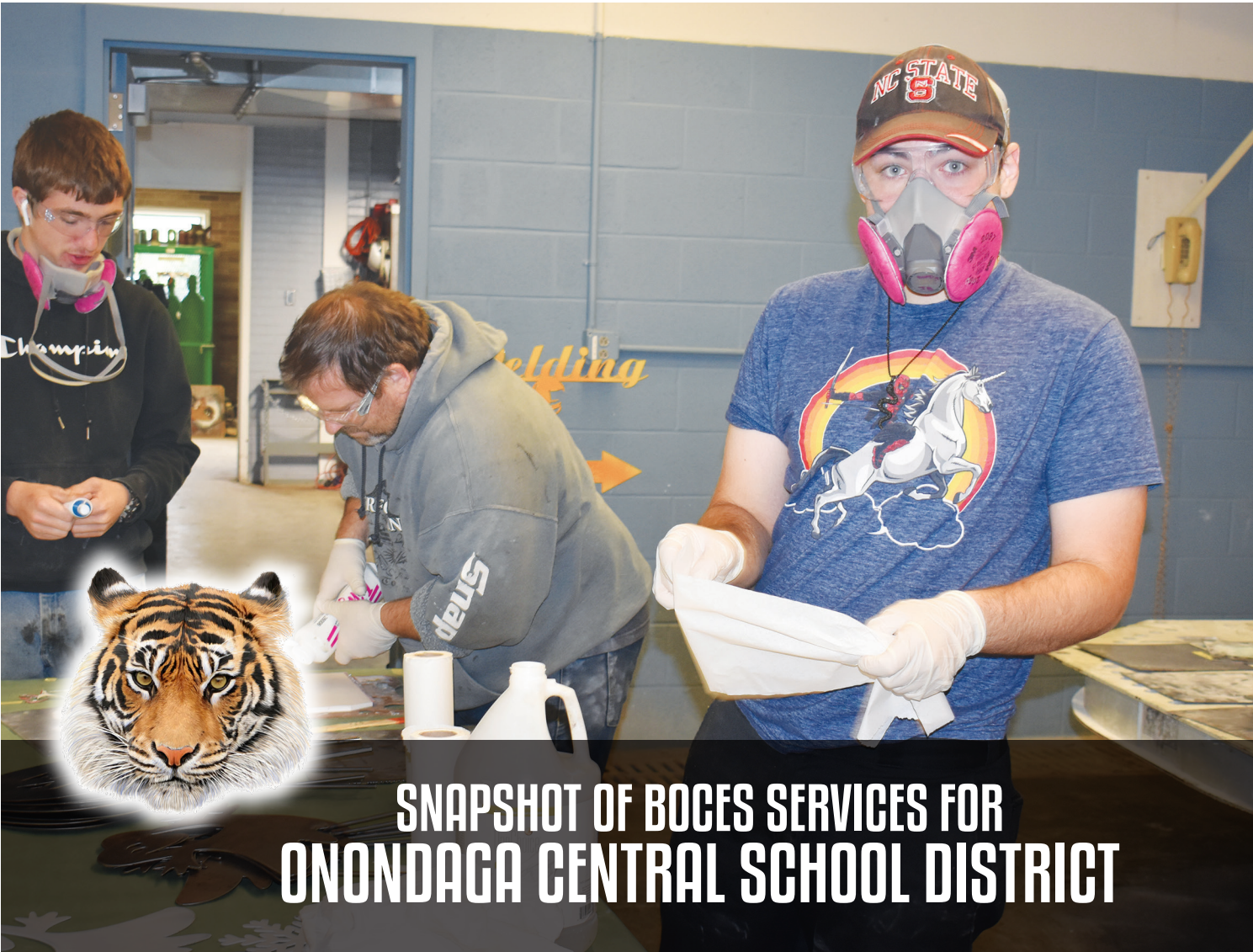







Onondaga's share of the 2022-23 BOCES administrative budget

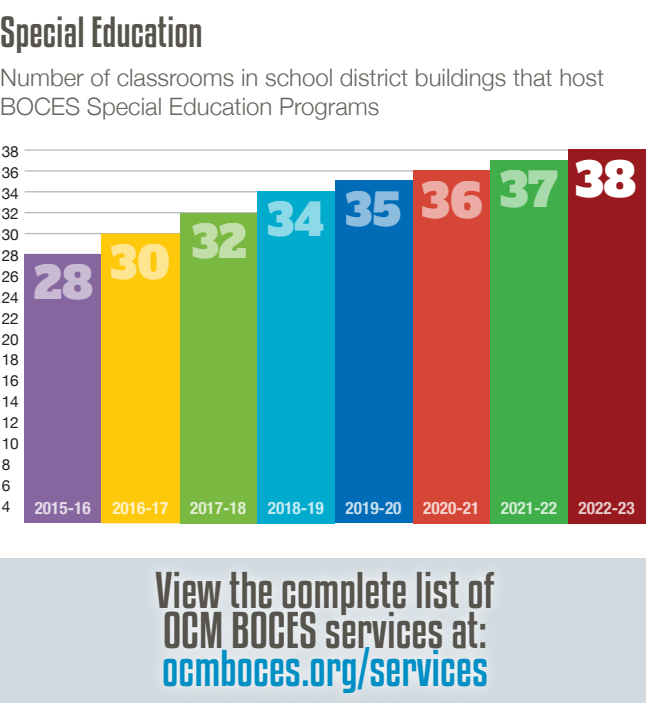

Career & Technical Education

New York State’s approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.


In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES’ component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Onondaga students Shaelyn Bell, Conner Matthews, and Tyreise Roberts.

OCM BOCES & Onondaga = Student Success



Inside the OCM BOCES TEAM classroom at C.W. Baker High School, Onondaga senior Dejon Stephens has been consistently learning and practicing daily living skills such as cooking, getting dressed for the weather, and interacting with others.

“These skills can be used in and out of school, so it is very good to see him making progress,” said his OCM BOCES teacher, Olivia Doner.

Beyond learning life skills, Dejon has benefitted from OCM BOCES in numerous ways. An initial reticence about coming to school has turned into daily excitement for seeing his teachers, his classmates and even a service dog that helps another student in the classroom. Dejon used to be fearful of dogs, but that fear has slipped away.

His social skills have greatly improved, too. “He is an outgoing young man who loves to talk and share laughs with his family and friends,” Doner said. “In fact, Dejon is most successful when he can be social with others.”

One of his favorite classroom activities is listening to stories. Dejon laughs along with the tales and loves the voices his teacher uses for different characters. He likes repeating funny lines to the whole class.

After graduation Dejon plans to attend a day program so he can continue to make friends, socialize with others, and stay close to his family.

Nicholas Aemmer, a teaching assistant, said Dejon is a joy to have in class.

“He is such a loving person,” he said. “He is always smiling.”

Did You Know?

The Onondaga Central School District currently has two students attending the OCM BOCES Virtual Learning Academy, or VLA. The VLA is broken up into grades K-5 for elementary, 7-8 for middle school, and 9-12 for high school. Teachers deliver “live” instruction via Google Meet throughout a traditional bell-scheduled day to students who cannot attend school in person. Teachers engage students in the curriculum by utilizing technology, delivering interactive lessons, and using breakout rooms for group work. Students also have the option to participate in Student Council, a virtual talent show, a digital yearbook club, and much more. Last year, Onondaga had six students who attended the VLA in grades 7-11.
