
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Solvay students Logan Bulla, Martin Cheney, Dylan Dunaway, Malachi Echevarria, Emily Garritillo, Angelina Plotitsyna, and Enrique Ramirez.

When Anastasiia Hys immigrated to the United States in July from the war-torn country of Ukraine, this young girl with crystal-blue eyes and a beaming smile had to adjust to a new home, a new culture, a new school and a new language.

Today, Anastasiia is thriving as a fifth-grade student in the OCM BOCES TEAM classroom at Solvay Middle School. Despite being non-verbal, "she has formed great relationships with the adults and other students in the classroom," said her teacher, Daniel Wood.

"In the short time Anastasiia has been with us, she has gone from a student who was hesitant to interact

with anyone to a student who greets all of her adults and classmates with a wave and a smile," Wood said. "She has become a great source of happiness for all of her classmates and teachers!"

In addition, Anastasiia has shown significant progress in developing her fine- and gross-motor skills, which she practices during her regular occupational therapy lessons. She is also learning functional communication skills, such as getting an adult's

"Anastasiia has demonstrated tremendous growth in that aspect," he said. "She loves getting to say hello to her teachers, therapists, and classmates, and will always give them a huge smile when they wave back. Anastasiia has even begun to wave 'hi' to other students in the hallway!"

Anastasiia's mother, Vita, has expressed her heartfelt gratitude to Wood and the entire BOCES staff in the TEAM classroom. She says everyone who works there, from the classroom staff to the bus drivers, has made BOCES a positive and pleasant atmosphere for her child.

That task is easier when you have a student like Anastasia, whom Wood describes as "a ball of positivity and sunshine."

"She faces every challenge with a smile on her face and has the most infectious laugh," he said. "It makes the classroom a great place to be, and we're very happy to have her here with us."
