
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Tully students Daniel Clemens, Wesley Craig, Colby LaBarge, Vincent Nelson, Jasmine Rockwell, Damian Schaal, Ryan Shute, Jessica Smith, Malakai Valdez, and Adrianna Vantassel.

For Tully senior Daniel "Finn" Foody, the New Vision Criminal Justice Program at OCM BOCES was an easy choice. His grandfather, James T. Foody, was a former state trooper and Syracuse police chief. Finn loved hearing his grandfather's stories and became fascinated with every aspect of law enforcement, from its history to its training requirements to its day-to-day procedures and more.

"Growing up and hearing about how my grandfather was able to positively change people's lives was deeply inspiring," Finn said. "I have always hoped to do the same, to be able to protect those who need protecting, and help those who need helping."

The New Vision Criminal Justice program sits in the heart of downtown, on the eighth floor of the John. H. Mulroy Civic Center. It offers ample space and a convenient location for students to hear

presentations from current and former law enforcement officers, prosecutors, defense lawyers and other professionals related to the criminal justice field. The instructor, Kelly Cunningham, came to the class with a 25-year career in the Syracuse Police Department and several years of experience as a criminal justice instructor in the region.

Finn enjoys getting an "inside view" of law enforcement through the stories and advice offered by guest speakers and the opportunity to have one-on-one conversations with them. He is committed to becoming an officer after going to college.

"This class will allow me to enter the field with an advantage, having already had many of the lessons that others may be hearing the first time," he said.

Cunningham said Finn is a conscientious student who has proven himself to be a leader in the class. He is especially adept at critical thinking and writing. "Finn's essays are very well written," she said. "His topics are on point. He analyzes the facts, and his supporting examples are

outstanding." A long-time teaching assistant in the class, Denise Mecca, said Finn stands out.

"He is a hard-working and understanding young man who has a bright future ahead of him," she said.
