
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to realworld situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2022, 294 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Westhill students Francesca Argentieri, Charles Knoll, Joshua O'Connor, Ibrahim Omar, and Magnolia Wilkinson.

Looking back, Brady Richardson says his motivation for attending the OCM BOCES Automotive Technology program was simple: He wanted to try something new. Today the Westhill High School senior says he loves working on cars, enjoys spending time with his classmates from other districts, and is thrilled to see that his grades - once a struggle - are "better than ever."

"The automotive field touches all of us, and it's good to have a background in it," he said. "Plus, BOCES has helped me learn people skills that I will be able to use throughout my life."

Automotive Technology is a two-year program that provides students with a combination of theoretical study and hands-on lab work, focusing on brake systems, engine performance diagnosis, suspension and steering, and electronic control systems. Students benefit from internship experiences and have the opportunity to earn a Career & Technical Endorsement on their high school diploma after

passing an industry-standard assessment.

Brady does not have specific career plans at the moment, but he loves cars, driving, and working with his hands, which means automotive technology is a possibility. He ultimately wants to have a career that "makes a difference in people's lives."

Sam Azria, his OCM BOCES instructor, said Brady is great to have in class because he is a "consistently good student and a good influence on his peers."

"Brady often helps his classmates with their projects and gets along with everyone," Azria said.

If Brady chooses to pursue a career in the automotive field, he will likely do well. Brady excelled as a junior when the class worked on electrical boxes and demonstrated high proficiency with wiring and soldering. This year, Brady continues to collaborate with others and seems more and more interested in the field and what to expect from a real-world job. "Either way, it's always good to know about cars," Azria said.
