Search for a new OCM BOCES District Superintendent continues

Here is an update from Dr. Brian Hartwell, District Superintendent of Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES, who is facilitating the process with our OCM BOCES Board of Education:

As you know, the OCM BOCES Board of Education is seeking a District Superintendent/CEO following the retirement in June of Dr. Jody Manning. The Commissioner of Education has appointed Dr. Brian K. Hartwell, District Superintendent of Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES, to assist the OCM BOCES Board of Education as its search consultant. By law, a BOCES Board of Education has the responsibility to select a District Superintendent, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Education. To that end, a top priority of the OCM BOCES Board of Education is to hire a District Superintendent who will meet the emerging needs of the region, component districts, and the BOCES. Dr. Hartwell has met with the Board of Education to outline their process and move the search forward. To date, the position is posted through September 13. A survey was also emailed (using Survey Monkey) to stakeholders. Preliminary interviews will be scheduled with Dr. Hartwell on a rolling basis. The Board of Education will meet again on September 25 to review applicants and select those who will move forward in the process.

As we move into the fall, stakeholder groups will be established and trained in preparation for final candidate interviews. Each stakeholder group, as well as the Board of Education, will interview finalists. The Board of Education will make the final decision on the candidate(s) to be interviewed by the Commissioner of Education. Although early, the process is on track.

We will be sure to provide regular updates as we move through the first semester.



Don't forget security awareness training

In light of increased cyberattacks targeted at schools and other organizations across the country, all employees at OCM BOCES are required to undergo security awareness training by the end of September. As Deputy Superintendent **Colleen Viggiano** said, "As we begin this new academic year, all too many



school districts across the country are spending this time working through the confusion and frustration of data breaches and ransomware attacks. It is an important time for all of us to learn more about these threats and how we can protect information about our own students, staff, and the school districts we serve."

This fully interactive training, which was shared with all employees through an email, takes participants through four modules: Your Role, Common Threats, Social Engineering Red Flags and Danger Zone. You'll also learn from real-world scenarios showing you strategies and techniques hackers use to take control of an organization like ours. The training also covers the seven areas of an email that can contain red flags that alert you to a possible attack. As the training demonstrates, "most of these dangers are the result of our own actions," Viggiano said. "By learning more about those dangers, we can each contribute to the safety and well-being of BOCES and the people we serve."

2019 Notice of Availability, Asbestos Management Plans

As provided under the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (40 CFR 763), the Onondaga-Cortland-Madison Board of Cooperative Educational Services hereby makes known the steps it has undertaken to comply with AHERA and the availability of asbestos management plans.

- In 1988, OCM BOCES contracted with the firm of O'Brien & Gere Engineers, Inc. of Syracuse, NY to survey our buildings and construct a management plan for each of our facilities. Mandatory re-inspections have been performed every three years since then. The last re-inspection was conducted in June 2019. Management plans for applicable facilities were updated accordingly.
- 2. The re-inspection information was submitted to the State Education Department as required.
- 3. Periodic surveillance is conducted on a six-month cycle.
- 4. The Maintenance and Operations staff have completed an Awareness Training program.
- 5. All response actions taken are within Federal and State guidelines.
