# Save Money With Mail Order Prescriptions

Excellus BCBS has chosen PrimeMail to replace Express Scripts to provide mail order prescription services effective January 1, 2009. If you currently fill prescriptions through Express Scripts, you should have already been notified of the change.

If you have never utilized the mail order service, now is a good time to consider it. If you currently take maintenance medication and you receive a 90-day prescription, you qualify to have that prescription filled through the PrimeMail service.

Your co-pay for mail order scripts is \$10 for generic drugs and \$20 for brand name drugs. This saves you one retail co-payment each time you renew your prescription through mail order.

# Literacy Connection Sponsors Workshops in Deaf Program


On November 17<sup>th</sup> members of the Literacy Connection: Brenda Anderson Thomas, Barb Brigham, Tracie Clark, Susan Davoli, Mary DeMatteo Vitale, and Rosanna Grund sponsored the first of four literacy workshops for parents and students in the OCM BOCES Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program at Solvay Elementary School.

The parents participated in a workshop given by Brenda Anderson-Thomas, a school psychologist, Barb Brigham, and Mary DeMatteo Vitale, teachers of the Deaf at Solvay Elementary School on strategies to promote literacy at home with their children. The parents each were given a reading binder with strategies which included story mapping activities, reading logs, and key ideas while reading to their children. They were also each given their own copy of the book, <u>Annie and the Wild Animals</u> by Jan Brett. Brenda modeled how to share this book with their children. While the parents were at the parent workshop, the students worked with Susan Davoli, a speech and language teacher, and Traci Clark an interpreter/ assistant in creating their own "reading bags" and literacy activities.

The parents, staff, and students joined for a book sharing. Parents shared the book <u>Annie and the Wild Animals</u> with their child with support from a staff



member. The next parent workshop will be on January 29<sup>th</sup> and the topic will include information on language development and how it relates to literacy development.





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#### Kasson Road Students Learn About Fire Safety in Social Studies



In November, Mrs. Braun's K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade class at Kasson Road School studied fire safety in Social Studies. Assistant Fire Chief, Fred Isgar, of the Howlett Hill Fire Volunteer Department spent time explaining to the students how to protect themselves in case of fire.
