Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

After seeing firsthand how physical therapy can help so many people, including herself, Chittenango senior Kiara Waite knew she had found her career of choice. By enrolling in the OCM BOCES Career & Technical Education Physical Therapy Professions program, Kiara is already preparing for her future by gaining hands-on, real-world experience in the field. The program has also helped Kiara get a head start on college — by the end of this school year, she will have 19 college credits.

After injuring her knee a few years ago, Kiara — a runner on the varsity cross country, indoor and outdoor track teams at Chittenango — went to physical therapy for rehabilitation.

“I liked the environment and realized how much physical therapy actually helps a person,” Kiara said.

“I want to be able to do that for other people and help them. I know what it feels like to feel helpless, so it would be nice to see others smile in that situation.”

Kiara's teacher, Dr. Jennifer Tucker-Locke, is confident that Kiara is gaining the skills she needs to prepare for her journey to become a physical therapist. She cites Kiara's ability to manage an impressive workload, on top of her extracurricular activities schedule, as part of this preparation.

“Kiara is able to manage her time very well and never turns in an assignment late or incomplete,” Tucker-Locke said. “Even while remote last year, she stayed on top of her coursework and excelled. She provides great insight in class discussions and is professional throughout. Kiara will make a wonderful physical therapist in a few years!”

Did You Know?

The Chittenango Central School District has added an additional ADAPEP counselor this year, which means the district now has an ADAPEP counselor at each building. Students benefit from the delivery of evidence-based programs for prevention, early intervention, and prevention counseling. Counselors benefit from monthly meetings that provide opportunities for collegiality, professional learning on topics integral to the field, participation in clinical supervision, monthly newsletters, weekly office hours, and access to evidence-based programs.
