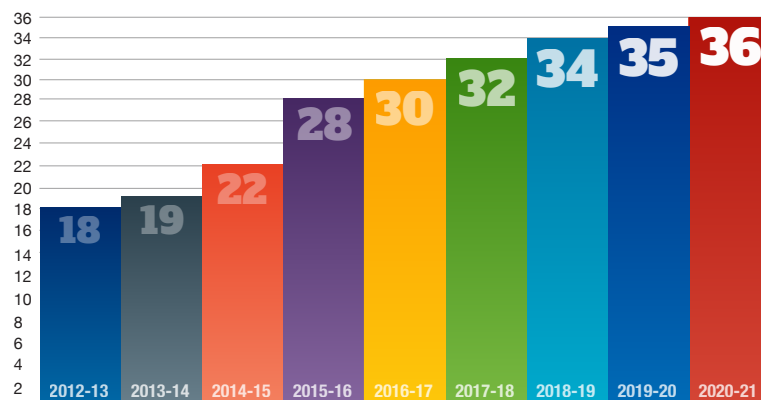
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Cincinnatus students Brittany Ayers, Brandon Bergman, Skye Bohanan, Anthony Bush, Emilee Case, Michaela Delavan, Joseph Farrow, Logan George, Kaleb Jones, Theodore Law III, Hunter Rickert, Joseph Roberts, Billi Robinson, Leann Rutan, Jacob Supley, Gauge Taylor, Christopher Torto, and H. Cincinnatus freshman Alexandria "Alex" Janeski has always admired the presentation and public speaking skills of Seven Valleys New Tech Academy graduates. That's why she chose Seven Valleys for herself — she wanted to master those skills.

When she arrived in September, however, she discovered so much more.

"The people here are great, the teachers here all understand how we learn, and there are more opportunities to learn in different ways," Alex said.

In her first few months at Seven Valleys, Alex already feels more confident in her ability to "find new solutions when something doesn't work the first time." She has also made progress in her communications skills. Seven Valleys Principal Amy Drumluk said Alex seemed quiet and reserved at the start of the year but has since "come out of her shell" to share her opinions and discuss the topics she is interested in and passionate about.

"She advocates for what she wants to learn, which will enhance her content knowledge," Drumluk said.

Alex's facilitators have also noticed a blooming leader in the school. They say Alex has a positive attitude, actively participates in class, and has a passion for learning.

"Alex comes in every day with something new and exciting she wants to explore in class," said Elisa Rodriguez, a facilitator. "She has found such a great way to combine her passions out of school with what she is learning in the classroom."

Did You Know?

Cincinnatus K-12 teachers worked with OCM BOCES to increase student engagement in their respective classrooms. Meeting in the morning and after school, teachers engaged in an observation-feedback cycle. Teachers set individual goals, learned about the differences between compliance and engagement, and worked to incorporate more active participation strategies into their instruction.
