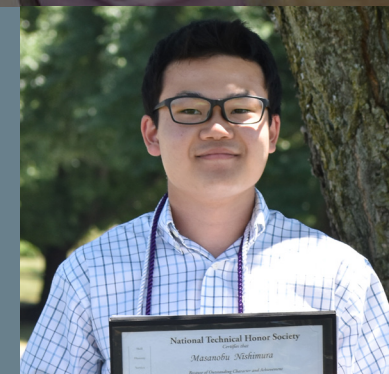

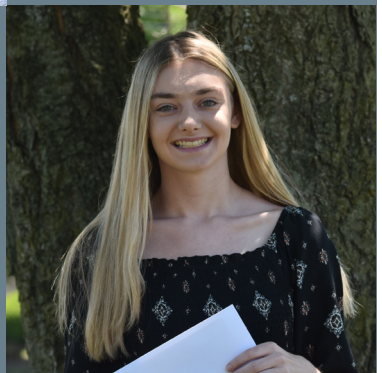

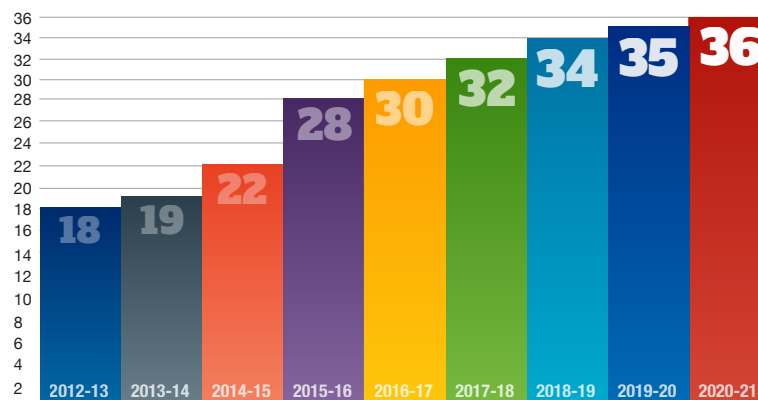
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas.

Sixth-grader Corbin Dalere has benefited greatly from being in the general education setting at Camillus Middle School while also having a small, supportive classroom through the OCM BOCES SED 6-8 Transition Program.

The 1:1 environment, as well as counseling and other resources, have helped Corbin to improve his academic skills while also enhancing life skills such as self-awareness, empathy, critical thinking, communication, problem-solving and teamwork, said his OCM BOCES teachers, Natalie Sgroi and Ashley Russo. Incidents of frustration have decreased as Corbin has learned new coping strategies, such as independently taking a break from classwork and returning to it within a few minutes.

Positive relationships with peers and adults have given him the support and confidence he needs to try challenging academic work, they said. Corbin has also shown marked improvement in being

socially aware, understanding social cues and handling difficult social situations.

"Throughout his journey, Corbin has become very social with his peers and with adults in school," Sgroi said. "He easily creates and maintains conversations and is eager to share his interests with others. He is kind and thoughtful. He is inclusive. He is funny and confident in himself. He encourages others to do their best and works hard to do his best as well."

Corbin's favorite subject is science, especially space science. Corbin likes space "because there is so much we don't know about space and he wants to discover it," his teacher said. He often does his own research on the topic to learn more. His dream is to become an astronaut.

Social Worker Lorrie Martin said Corbin has had a positive influence on his classmates.

"Corbin's colorful personality always brings life to whatever space he is in," she said. "His humor brings laughter, his caring gestures demonstrate kindness, and his amazing smile lights up the room! It is a joy to be part of Corbin's educational journey."
