


Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Fayetteville-Manlius student Cody Granger.



In high school, she kept the pattern going with more cars, bridges and hand-carved wooden designs she uses for birthday gifts.

This year, as a senior, Isabel is participating in the OCM BOCES New Vision Engineering Professions Program with Lockheed Martin, and she could not be happier. The class has let her take a deep dive into design and engineering concepts, take courses for college credit, and learn about a wide range of real-world engineering professions. She is also building things, such as bridges and paper

towers. Isabel recently began one of the most appealing aspects of the program — a formal internship at Lockheed Martin, where she has learned how to develop products within an Integrated Product Team (IPT) and develop skills related to different types of engineering in the IPT.

"Through this program, I will narrow my focus to a specific branch of engineering, get more hands-on experience, and better understand engineering," Isabel said. "All these experiences will allow me to select and attend the best engineering school for me, setting me on a career path I will enjoy the rest of my life."

Her instructor, Greg Garcia, says Isabel is learning about engineering but also honing several professional skills that will help her achieve success, including interpersonal communication, organization, collaboration, and time management.

"Isabel has proven herself as a leader, and she is a very active participant in our in-class discussion and projects," he said. "She is an absolute pleasure to have in our New Vision Engineering course."
