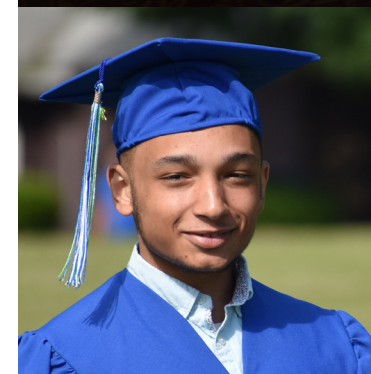

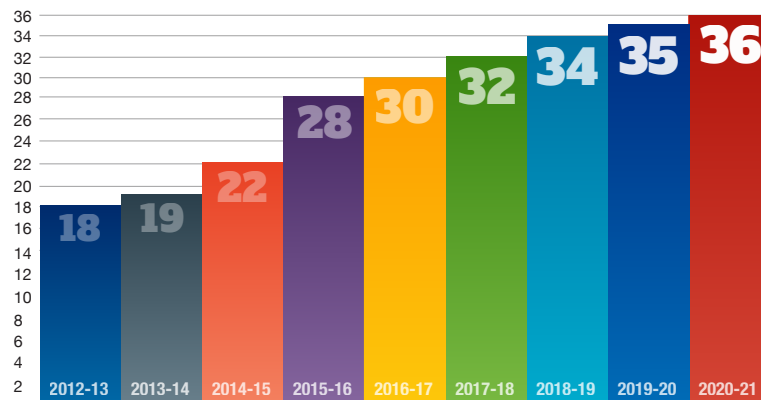
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

## OCM BOCES & North Syracuse = Student Success



Peter Hocking, a second-grader from the North Syracuse Central School District, has made notable gains since joining the OCM BOCES SKATE Program at Mott Road Elementary School three years ago.

The SKATE Program is a 12:1:4 classroom for students on the autism spectrum. The program models the TEACCH philosophy, which emphasizes a structured routine, visual learning, a predictable schedule, and a positive reinforcement plan — all of which help Peter feel more comfortable in the classroom. To assist with his communication needs, Peter uses an Augmentative and Alternative Communication (ACC) device, which also helps him with his letters, numbers, and reading comprehension. As an added bonus, he gets to learn and interact with his

peers in a general education setting.

“Every day, we see progress with Peter being in the SKATE program,” said his teacher, Corinne Campbell.

Peter's positive energy is contagious. His teaching assistant, Alexa Bressett, and his physical therapist, Katie Mannara, both mentioned his enthusiasm in taking on new tasks.

“I love Peter's excitement for school,” Bressett said. “He is always happy to greet his teachers and friends.”

Mannara echoed that sentiment, saying, “Peter is always eager to move and is making great strides in physical therapy.”

Campbell described one recent project that Peter especially loved. Students created a “Chicka Chicka Boom Boom” tree — a project based on the popular children's book.

“Peter loved spelling his name on the Chicka Chicka Boom Boom tree and counting how many letters were in his name,” Campbell said. “Chicka Chicka Boom Boom has always been one of Peter's favorites!”

During the switch to remote learning in the spring of 2020, the Mid-State Regional Bilingual Education Resource Network provided financial support for expanded translation and interpretation for English Language Learners (ELLs) and their families throughout the North Syracuse Central School District.
