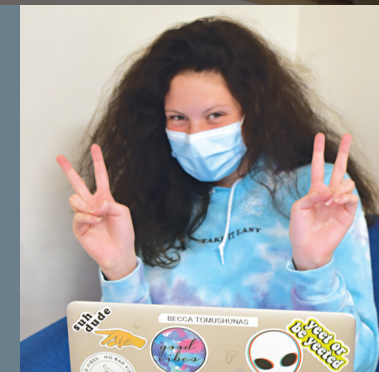

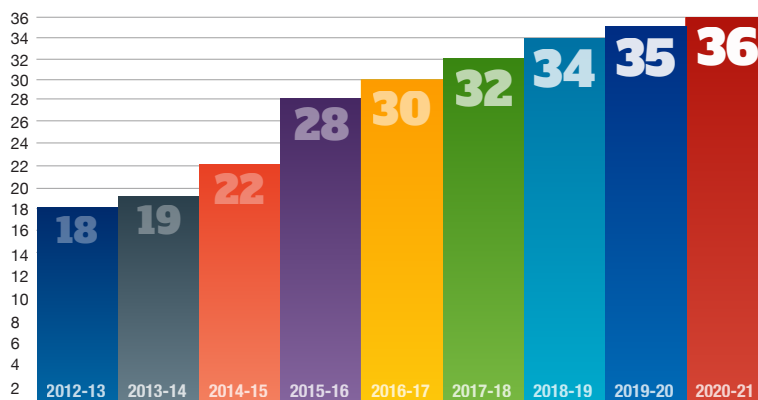
## Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Tully students Joseph Argus, Bryan Brame, Justin Chawgo, Cassondra Fisher, Eugene Hemingway, Ashton Henry, Travis Kent, Kyle Koons, Brooke Malchak, Amber Maloney, Brookelynn Marshall, Meagan Porter, Dylan Rosekrans, Cameron Trammel, Payton Vantassel, and Emily Wolf.

## OCM BOCES & Tully = Student Success



In just a few short months at Seven Valleys New Tech Academy, Chelsie Trafton is confident she made the right choice. The ninth-grader from the Tully Central School District loves the high school's emphasis on project-based learning because it allows her to direct her own learning, collaborate with peers, express her opinions and practice her presentation skills. She also appreciates having an upper-level classmate to serve as her mentor and enjoys the interdisciplinary approach to subject areas, noting her favorite subjects are Global Lit, which combines Global History and Literature, and Espanarte, which combines Spanish and Art.

After recently switching to remote learning, little has changed. Chelsie "is very persistent in attending classes and participating," said one of her facilitators, Thomas Beasley. "She is timely and attentive to her learning. She asks for help to get support with her learning and completes assignments with effort."

Chelsie says the small class sizes and hands-on learning has boosted her confidence and helped her retain more information. She believes her biggest gains have come in two areas: communicating with others, and presenting her work to the class. All those skills, she said, will prepare her well for her next goal — going to college.

Principal Amy Drumluk is confident Chelsie will succeed. Her flexibility with online instruction, as well as her determination in the face of change, has had a positive influence on others.

"Chelsie contributes to our positive school culture with her perseverance, enthusiasm and energy," Drumluk said. "She has had to make some transitions in learning this year, and she has done so with a commitment to our program and to her education. She is a true model of what a Seven Valleys student is all about."

## Did You Know?

The Tully Central School District utilized literacy coaching offered by OCM BOCES throughout the year to support the literacy knowledge of their teachers in multiple areas. Teachers were able to meet with the coach monthly to discuss interventions, support classroom core instruction/programs, and to further discuss topics around the science of reading. Some teachers also took part in observation and feedback cycles.
