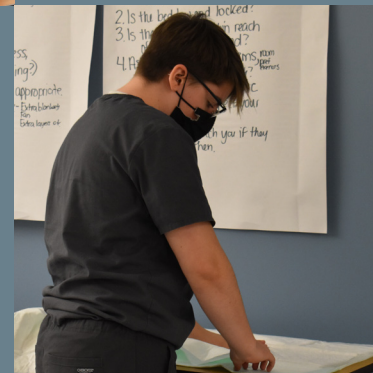


Westhill's share of the 2020-21 BOCES administrative budget **\$72,417**

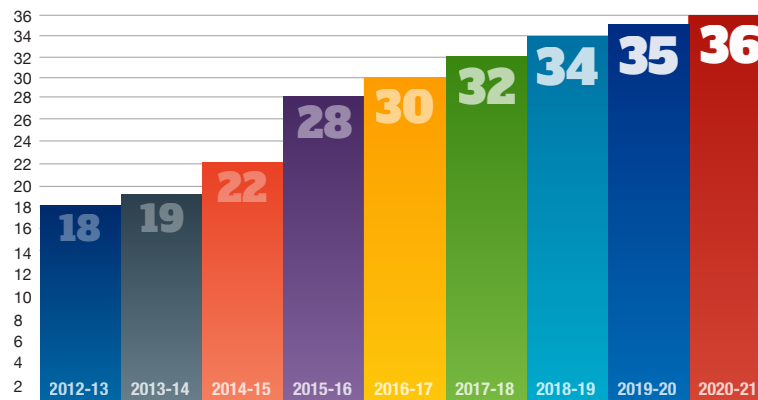
Career & Technical Education

New York State's approval process for Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs has raised the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential or certificate at the postsecondary level, or an associate or baccalaureate degree. CTE courses offer students the opportunity to apply academic concepts to real-world situations and prepare them for industry-based assessments or certifications. They have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing while still in high school and take part in work-based learning opportunities where they demonstrate mastery of skills essential in the workplace. In addition, our Technically Endorsed programs, embedded in area businesses, have been recognized by *District Administration* magazine as one of more than 30 national innovative programs.

In 2020, 441 seniors from OCM BOCES' component districts were eligible to earn CTE endorsements on their high school diplomas, including Westhill students Deanna Abraham, Adam Amaya, Dylan Amidon-Crawford, Dominick Carfagno, Alyiah Geiger, Kevin Kelly, and Chase Nesheiwat.

OCM BOCES & Westhill = Student Success



Isabella "Bella" Willette-Niemczal, a 10th-grader from Westhill, has demonstrated "tremendous" academic and social growth during her past two years in the OCM BOCES LaFayette Transition Program, according to School Social Worker Renee Fragale. She believes the partnership between OCM BOCES and Westhill, which has allowed Bella to change programs as her needs have evolved, has been "paramount to her success."

"The consistency and flexibility across OCM BOCES programs have allowed Bella to grow emotionally and academically in a safe space and at her own pace," Fragale said. "Bella has learned to trust, accept help, and utilize coping skills independently. This has contributed to Bella's success in high school. Her academic and social growth have been tremendous over the past two years."

During her eight years in BOCES programs, Bella says the biggest benefit has been the coping skills she has learned to better focus on her academics.

"Before I came to BOCES I had a really hard time getting any work done, like *any*," she said. "It was due to the fact that I didn't have many coping skills at my disposal, and my emotions kept getting out of hand. But when I went to BOCES, even within the first year I had learned many things that helped me stay in class."

Bella has now become a hard-working, dedicated student with a clever wit, a penchant for descriptive writing and an attitude that doesn't let challenges stop her, said her teacher, Robert Littlehale, and other members of the OCM BOCES LaFayette staff.

"Bella's success lies in her ability to advocate for herself and let the staff know what she needs to be successful," said Theresa Harris-Folsom, a teaching assistant. "She is a talented writer, but wholeheartedly admits she does not like math. Regardless of her feelings about math, she works hard at building her skills and asks for help when she needs it."

Bella knows that learning the math and science Regents curriculum will help her reach her dream of someday becoming a pilot, writing, "I hope that career path takes *flight* and, if it does, my happiness will *soar*."

Did You Know?

Itinerant Services provided English as a New Language (ENL) support to the Westhill Central School District's growing English Language Learner (ELL) population. ENL teacher Yanira Stoker, who has nearly 20 years of ENL and bilingual education experience, provided in-person and hybrid learning support to six ELLs in second and third grade. She also offered daily online support to help the students' learning process and to make sure their social, emotional, and technological needs were met. In addition, Ms. Stoker provided parent outreach and support during the remainder of the school year during remote learning.
